BACKGROUND

- The Role of Municipal Government in Pennsylvania:
 - 1. Provide Necessary Services to the Community
 - 2. Enforce Rules for the Good of the Community
- Financial Responsibility:
 - 1. Raise the Funds Needed to Provide Services
 - 2. Ensure that Township Funds are spent responsibly and according to the adopted budget
- The PA Department of Community & Economic Development requires:
 - ✓ Annual Financial Reporting
 - ✓ Audits



Budget Adoption Requirements:

- ✓ Manager must prepare and present a proposed budget to the Board of Commissioners;
- ✓ Budget must be open for public inspection for at least 20 days;
- ✓ Must be adopted by Ordinance before end of fiscal year.

Year in Review - Accomplishments

<u>Finance:</u> implemented new accounting system in keeping with Best Practices for Governmental Accounting; implemented new cash management policies to maximize interest earnings on funds (budgeted interest income was \$43,000; projected actual income \$68,000);

<u>Administrative Functions:</u> implemented online payroll processing and police scheduling software systems to increase efficiency in back-office operations;

<u>Personnel:</u> Negotiated 3-year employment contract with Chief of Police and 4-year Collective Bargaining Agreement with Public Works;

<u>Township-owned property:</u> Negotiated agreement with Golden Triangle Construction for site development and installation of fencing at 3477 Mount Troy Road;

<u>Transparency:</u> Instituted quarterly Town Hall meetings and monthly Manager meetings to allow more public input and discussion on community issues. Board meeting videos now posted on Township website for public viewing;

<u>Contracts:</u> Negotiated Operations & Maintenance Agreement with Pittsburgh Water & Sewer Authority, negotiated new 2-year lease with Reserve VFD for Township office space, advertised and awarded new 3-year contract for trash collection services;

<u>Infrastructure Projects:</u> Arlington/Pittview Slide Remediation, Additional Storage Space added for Road Salt at Spring Garden Storage Facility, Hoffman Rd Waterline Phase 3, Logan Street Retaining Wall (in-progress).

2024 Challenge: Expenses rising faster than Revenues

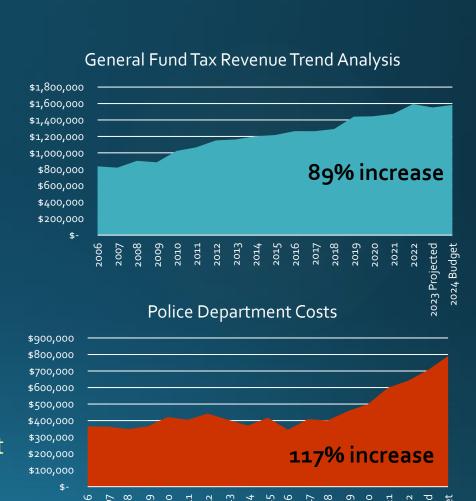
- --Main source of General Fund Revenue is taxes from 2006 through 2024, <u>Tax Revenue increased 89%.</u>
 - -- Over the same period Police Department costs increased 117%.

> <u>Why?</u>

- --Tax base has been relative stable no population increase, no development
 - -- Increase in Tax-Exempt Properties (Allegheny Land Trust)
 - -- Wage inflation and benefits have increased dramatically

➤ Solutions?

- -- May need to increase property taxes in future years
- --New development would increase tax base
- --Look for other revenue sources: apply for all available grants, invest funds to maximize interest earnings
- --Find ways to cut costs and increase operational efficiencies
- --Reduce services only as a last resort

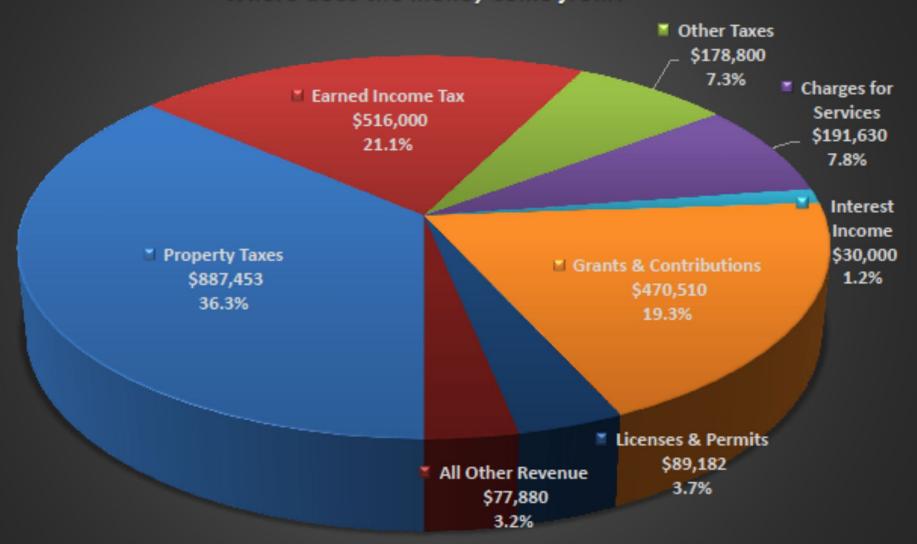

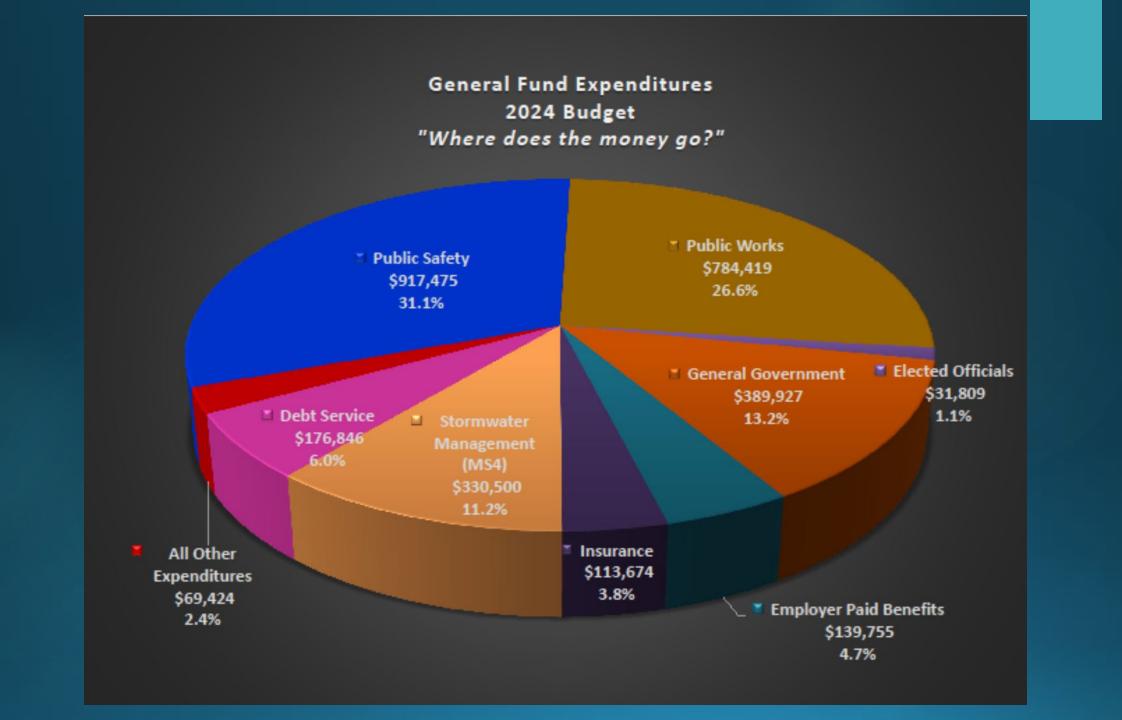

Water and Sewer Operations:

- ➤ In mid-2024, Pittsburgh Water & Sewer Authority will take over operations and maintenance of the Township's water and sanitary sewer systems;
- > Billing will change from quarterly to monthly;
- Customers will contact PWSA for questions on billing and service disruptions:
- Monthly minimum usage will be 1,000 gallons;
- Customers will receive a new AMI (Advanced Metering Infrastructure) meter at no cost;
